- 1. State Library of Victoria. The event is the "mass suicide" of Victorian Skeptics overdosing on Brauer homeopathic sleeping pills
- 2. One of several "Avenues of Honour" tree-lined warmemorial avenues leading into the main thoroughfare of Victorian country towns, all in danger of being lost to highway upgrades. This one happens to be in Bacchus Marsh.
- 3. This is a male budgerigar. The "budgie" is a small parrot native to Australia. You can tell this one is a male by the blue "cere" above its beak.
- 4. TV Sketch Comedian Mark Mitchell in his role of Con the Fruiterer in the very popular *Comedy Company* series
- 5. Cast photo for the TV series *The Flying Doctors*
- 6. Above is the logo of the ABC (Australian Broadcasting Corporation formerly Commission). It represents one of the simplest in a family of mathematical curves known as Lissajous figures (below) which are easily generated in cathode ray tubes; Early TV sets used cathode ray tubes to display the image.
- 7. Two views of athletics coach Percy Cerutty and his protégé Herb Elliott. The sandhills at Portsea were a famous part of Cerutty's training regimen. Elliott was a middle-distance runner who set many world records. His Gold Medal for the 1960 Olympic 1500 m race was perhaps surprising in that it was his only Olympic medal.
- 8. The Rev. Tim Costello, Baptist minister and front-person for World Vision Australia. A lawyer by training and once mayor of St Kilda, he is one of National Trust's 100 national living treasures. Brother of former Federal Treasurer Peter Costello.
- 9. Missy Higgins, singer-songwriter, nominated for 28 ARIA Awards, winner of 8.

- 11. Samantha Stosur, former world No. 1 in doubles tennis, former world No. 4 in singles
- 12. Harry Kewell, soccer coach and former player capped 58 times for the Australian team.
- 13. Beyond Blue logo. Beyond Blue is an Australian mental health and wellbeing support organisation. Founded by Jeff Kennett, a former Liberal premier of Victoria, in 2000, Beyond Blue is currently chaired by Julia Gillard, a former Labour prime minister of Australia.
- 14. Australian music history guru Glenn A Baker
- 15. Kate Langbroek, radio and television presenter and comedian.
- 16. Pole vaulter Emma George who set a string of World records in the 1990s
- 17. Steve Bracks, former Labour Premier of Victoria; Dr Bob Brown, Former leader of the Greens in the Senate; and Senator Pauline Hanson of Pauline Hanson's One Nation Party
- 18. Fatso the Fat-Arsed wombat, created as an unofficial Sydney 2000 Olympic mascot for *The Dream with Roy and HG* on the Seven Network
- 19. Skipping Girl Vinegar sign (colloquially known as Little Audrey) is an historic animated neon sign in the inner suburb of Abbotsford, Melbourne, and was possibly the first animated neon sign in Australia when first erected in 1936. The current sign is a reproduction of the original, which was removed well after the product it advertised was no longer available.
- 20. Former Australian cricket captain Alan Border
