


Vic Skeptics May 2021 **Strange Notions**

- 65. Semi-precious gemstone exhibiting parallel bands of colour, often black [4]

- 71. & 73 across: Heavily promoted and expensive additives to the diet, usually unsupported by an adequate evidence base and which in general can be safely ignored [4, 11]

- 78. The study of the celestial bodies in the belief that they have an influence on human affairs [9]

- 1. Of Persian origin, an honorific for a holy or wise man [4]
- 2. William ______, Austrian physician, inventor of the "orgone accumulator", a portable cupboard in which a patient would sit in order to build up "orgone energy" [5]
- 3. Light African spear [7]
- 5. Prejudice, partiality, favouritism [4]
- 6. To be in debt [3]
- 8. & 22 down: Cereologists study these artifacts under the misapprehension that they have extra-terrestrial origins [4, 7]
- 9. & 24 down & 33 down: A piece of planetary pareidolia which caused much excitement after its discovery in 1976. Interest has since waned as photographic resolution has improved [4, 2, 4]
- 10. & 44 down: The belief that Jews were not systematically executed in large numbers by Nazis and others [9, 6]
- 11. The use of a device which measures physiological indicators to determine whether a person is lying. Has been demonstrated to be highly unreliable [10]
- 12. & 29 down: Recurring period during which "lunatic" behaviour was thought to be at its peak [4, 4]
- 13. 'Energy highways' in the human body, postulated by acupuncturists but never observed by anatomists [9]
- 15. Himalayan counterpart of 57 across [4]
- 18. Populous Asian nation [5]
- 19. To burn superficially [5]
- 21. Movement of objects using mental power alone [13]

- 26. The pseudoscientific idea that our daily lives are governed by biological cycles with periods of 23, 28 and 33 days [10]

- 27. The greatest "weasel word" in advertising; suggests product efficacy but promises nothing [3]

- 35. To assist with the perpetration of a crime [4]
- 38. Aficionado, enthusiast [3]
- 40. One of a large group of Semitic people [4]
- 43. & 72 down: a.k.a. "poppett". A figurine representing an actual person, used to paranormally and remotely inflict harm on that person [6, 4]
- 44. See 10 down
- 45. Poem designed to praise or glorify [3]
- 46. Any of a large group of simple, non-flowering, usually aquatic plants including seaweeds [4]
- 47. Use of language which normally conveys the opposite meaning, for humour or emphasis [5]
- 48. To carry something of considerable weight [4]
- 50. One of a large phylum of animals characterised by an exoskeleton [9]
- 52. Oleaginous [4]

- 56. Challenge, provoke or goad into action [4]
- 58. & 75 down: a.k.a. Chinese geomancy; it postulates invisible qi forces that bind the universe, earth, and humanity together, and encourages rearrangement and realignment of structures, furniture, etc to best harmonise with those forces [4, 4]
- 60. A deer. A female deer [3]
- 63. Sudden chill and shivering [5]
- 64. Tradesperson concerned with the fitting and maintenance of pipes, etc [7]
- 66. Low seat, as featured in a nursery rhyme [6]
- 67. Latin for "tongue"; often used in in the sense of "language" [6]
- 69. Prefix meaning "below" [5]
- 70. Home base for trains, trams, buses etc [5]

- 73. Haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants [4]
- 74. Place, stead; In = In stead [4]
